The History of "Fubo-no-ishi"
In September 1961, a group of volunteers set out in the quest to articulate respect and condenses for the souls of 33 U.S. Air Force personnel who perished on Mt. Fubo during the Pacific conflict, those of World War II, as well as to pursue the lofty ambition of peace for all of mankind. They formed a coalition christened "Fubo-ishi", and collaborated to erect the "Fubo-no-ishi" monument.
At this time, with the completion of "Fubo Peace Memorial Park," and in the interest of repose on the legacy of our predecessors at this sacred location, we have prepared a replica of the cast metal epitaph on the monument erected near the foot of Mt. Fubo at that time, for installation at this site.
It warrants mention that, in the Fubo-no-ishi Monument Commemorative Magazine published in September 1961, it is stated that the Mayor of Shirasagi City, at the time, Mr. Kendo Aso, furnished the calligraphy letters for "Fubo-no-ishi" his brush for the purpose of this inscription in the spirit of mounting appeals for "eternal love" and "world peace."
